

Well done to all the participants on the day.


YOU CAN!


Manaaki Misfits

Hato Hone St John

Opportunities to work with like-minded community organizations opens opportunities for those clients who want to be a bigger part of their local community. Manaaki Ability Trust has been working away in the background with Hato Hone St John for almost a year now, working through their programmes and opportunities. It's heart-warming that as an organization, they are wanting to embrace different communities and be more inclusive.

Last year they ran the 3 Steps for Life session highlighting how to use our AED

devise on site, with 3 clients completing further training to work alongside Hato
Hone St John to deliver 3 Steps for Life out in the community. Earlier this year we had they delivered their Poipoia te Pitomata
Leadership programme, which was hugely successful, with every participant gaining their Level 1 Frist Aid Certificate, and we hope to be able to deliver this fantastic programme again. Several of our clients are exploring further volunteering opportunities in the community as a result of this. We look forward to what they have in store for our Wellbeing Programme in coming weeks.

HATO HONE WEAVING WELLBEING

Later this month Hato Hone St John will be joining us on Thursdays to facilitate their Hato Hone Weaving Wellbeing programme. Charlotte who facilitates our Wellbeing programme has been preparing our current group, introducing the foundations with clients focusing on gaining more confidence, becoming healthier, and understanding emotions and reactions. Our Wellbeing programme is open to new participants who may be interested in joining us on Thursday mornings from 9.30am.





Duke of Edinburgh Hillary Award

Our Award participants have been very busy over the summer months, working steadily towards completing various sections, and getting their assessors to sign off their hard work and efforts.

To kick the year off our Silver Duke of Edinburgh Hillary Award participants completed their Adventurous Journey. They chose to complete a 'Scientific Exploration' learning about local reserves that protect our endangered wildlife – specifically our native birds. In February they visited Nga Manu Reserve in Waikanae where

they did an amazing "Nighttime Kiwi Encounter Experience". The group was fortunate to see two Kiwis up close and personal, coming within hand reach. Of course, they weren't able to touch them, the trickiest part was staying quiet for a full 60 minutes, not to scare them off.

In March they ventured away for two nights, staying at El Rancho, and traveling to Kapiti Island for a day trip. Here they learned about the history of the reserve and spotted several birds in their natural habitat while completing various walks, including Weka, Takahe, Tui, Piwakawaka

(Fantails), and Tieke (Stitchbird). The group also had the opportunity to climb the northern end of Kapiti Island and experience fantastic views to the north while having their lunch. On the mainland, while at Waimanu Lagoon they also spotted Oystercatchers, black shags, and black swans amongst a variety of ducks.

We are very grateful for the enduring support of the Thai Shan Foundation, to help make our Adventurous Journeys happen. Their support for the Award has been constant since 2020, allowing well over 20 Adventurous Journeys to be completed at both bronze and silver levels. We are excited by the opportunities

this funding provides our clients

and everything that the Duke of Edinburgh Hillary Awards offer by way of life skills, adventure, and personal development for all participants.

We will be celebrating the completion of several award levels and sections, at our upcoming Showcase on May 19th, with an official presentation. Be sure to join us on the day to see certificates and badges presented, followed by an official photo!
